Pacific Arctic Group

- The Pacific Arctic Group (PAG) is an informal group of organizations and individuals having a Pacific perspective on Arctic science.
- Originally organized under the International Arctic Science Committee (IASC), PAG is now an independent affiliate of the IASC and has as its mission to serve as a Pacific Arctic regional partnership to plan, coordinate and collaborate on science activities of mutual interest.
- The PAG Executive committee is composed of Chair, Vice-Chairs (2), and lead-scientists from PAG synthesis activities.

















Pacific Arctic Group

- PAG has established five objectives:
- To identify gaps in knowledge and priority research needs across the Pacific Arctic Region (PAR) and seek means to implement programs and activities that address them.
- To facilitate and coordinate science operations among PAG member countries.
- To promote and facilitate data accessibility and integrated data bases for the region.
- To serve as a forum for information exchange on PAR science programs.
- To establish and maintain a direct link between PAG and other relevant science organizations.


















PAG endorsed projects
